Have enough staff for the amount of kids

Ideally have a Patrol leader who is a teen Scout, and also have an adult who isn't hands on, but is supporting the teen.

Have planning meetings involving ALL staff.

Train ALL staff on equipment like the stoves before the event. OR use easier alternatives.

Only cook for dinner; quick lunches, leave more time for activities during the day.
